This week, the PPD arboriculture group planted a series of trees to commemorate Arbor Day. UNM's Main and North Campus is home to over 5,000 trees, and the Grounds & Landscaping unit works hard to keep our trees healthy, vibrant, and abundant for all to enjoy.

Each year, the arborists at UNM try to plant as many trees as they can during the spring and fall to continue to have the lush urban forest that exists today on the UNM campus.

Bryan Suhr, supervisor for Arboriculture at PPD says, "I wouldn't be doing this without the help and the support of PPD and the Staff Council!"

For the last several years, the Staff Council has teamed up with PPD to engage and educate the community about the importance of trees and the positive effects they have on humans and the environment.

According to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), neighborhoods filled with trees report lower levels of domestic violence, are safer and more sociable, reduce stress of the body and mind, and decreases the need for medications and reduces recovery time from illness or injury.

Here are just a few of the trees that were planted recently on the UNM campus:

- 3 Corylus colurna, Turkish filbert, Westside of Family practice
- 1 Yedoensis flowering cherry, Southside of UNM Press
- 1 "New Horizon" elm tree at Eastside of Medical Library
- 2 Acer rubrum, Redpointe maple, Northwest corner of Anthropology
- 2 "New Horizon" elm trees at Eastside Johnson Field
- 1 Perfect Purple, Crabapple, in the Hokona Zia courtyard

Open Enrollment Continues

Open Enrollment for The University of New Mexico is now available through Friday, May 13th. Open Enrollment is a chance for UNM employees to enroll in or make changes to their participation in UNM benefit plans, including:

- Medical, dental and vision plans
- Life insurance
- Long-term disability
- Accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D)

The benefit changes made during Open Enrollment will take effect on July 1st of this year. Employees will not be able to make changes to their plan(s) after this period unless they experience a Qualifying Change of Status Event.

Note: If you make NO changes during this Open Enrollment period, your current benefits elections will continue for the 2016 – 2017 plan year.

<u>VEBA</u> **Opt-Out**: Applies to faculty and staff employed in a benefits-eligible position between June 30, 2013 – June 30 2015. Current VEBA participants have the opportunity to opt-out of VEBA contributions during the Open Enrollment period with an effective date of July 1, 2016. Opting out of VEBA participation is only permitted during this period, and results in the loss of any applicable grandfathered VEBA service credit and forfeiture of access to UNM Post-Retirement Benefits.
