PPD's leadership team is currently working to develop a short term plan to minimize any disruptions to the administrative functions of PPD.

Service Building Workout Room will house updated Equipment

The Service Building Workout Room is a convenient place to work out, and it's provided at no cost to employees. Recently, Rick Henrard, director of Planning, Design, and Construction (PDC), and Mike Reid, manager with PDC, have acquired some workout equipment at a very low cost that will replace the equipment currently in this room.

PPD and PDC have collaborated to purchase this equipment in order to update the quality of equipment and encourage more use amongst staff in the Service Building. Employee wellness is a core value within Institutional Support Services (ISS) and is being demonstrated by this initiative.

"Not one other department in this University has provided what you have for your employees... that is something to be incredibly proud of. You are investing in your employees' wellness... kudos to you!" says Tracey Briggs, supervisor of the Wellness Program with Employee Health Promotion.

Briggs worked with Reid and Henrard to design the layout of the new equipment and space, and she has offered to hold orientation classes for individuals interested in learning how to use the new equipment safely and for maximum results.

The new equipment will include an elliptical machine, two stationary bicycles (one of them will be a recumbent bike), exercise balls, an FTS Glide dual stack cable resistance training system, and a new rack for the free weights (see schematic below).


