

## Albuquerque Rapid Transit (ART) construction is set to begin on October 17

The University of New Mexico (UNM) has been informed that the Albuquerque Rapid Transit (ART) project will begin construction at the intersection of Central Ave. and University Blvd., as well as Central Ave. between Girard and Stanford. On Monday, October 17, construction crews will begin removing the medians in these areas while maintaining at least one traffic lane in all directions.

UNM is advising the campus community to avoid this area or allow for extra time while commuting along Central Ave.

Bradbury Stamm recently announced a complete list of areas where construction is to begin throughout the ART Construction Corridor beginning October 17:

- The north side of the street between Cedar and Ash
- The intersection at University & Central, removing the median
- Median removal between Stanford and Girard
- Median removal between Wellesley and Carlisle
- Median removal between Washington and Monroe
